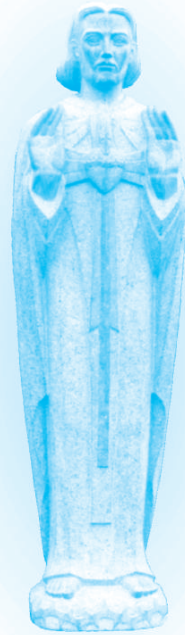

## Eighth Week of Ordinary Time

On the **Eighth Sunday of Ordinary Time**, Jesus gives us timeless and loving advice. Don't worry, don't fret. Our cares distract us from God unless we can place our worries directly in God's hands. "Your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given you besides. Do not worry about tomorrow; tomorrow will take care of itself."

The first readings this week are from **Sirach**, with their beautiful seeking of Wisdom. During the week, **Mark's Gospel** offers us stories about sacrificing part of ourselves. We hear of the Rich Young Man: "Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." At that statement, his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions. Peter tells Jesus, "We have given up everything and followed you." Jesus responds, "there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the Gospel who will not receive a hundred times more." When the disciples squabble over who will sit in glory with Jesus, he tells them, "the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." Bartimaeus, a blind man recognizes Jesus as "Son of David," is healed and follows Jesus. Jesus turns over the sellers' tables in the temple as the religious authorities look for a way to put him to death. When they try to entrap him with their questions, Jesus asks them about John the Baptist's baptism. They refuse to answer and Jesus says, "Neither shall I tell you by what authority I do these things."

On the **Ninth Sunday of Ordinary Time** Jesus compares the faith of his followers to a wise man who built his house on rock. **Matthew's Gospel** tells us that storms "buffeted the house. But it did not collapse; it had been set solidly on rock, withstanding storms, winds and rain."

This week before Lent begins can be a great time for us to reflect upon the journey that each of us is on. We are on the road with Jesus and we sometimes seem to be partially blind. We hear him describe for us how much he wants us to be intimately involved in his self-giving love for others, yet our everyday concerns are too often self-absorbed. And, for the big decisions and small choices we continually face, we seek wisdom, clarity, the path that is just, honorable, even heroic. The readings for this week really can help us shape the desires we talk with our Lord about in the background of our daily journey each day. We can start by asking for the grace not to be possessed by our possessions. A simple look around will help us get in touch with how attached we are to things that limit our availability to more completely follow Jesus. Even when we know how rewarding it is to follow our Lord, we are tempted to turn it into a temptation. Who doesn't ask, "Who is the greatest?" We need grace this week to be renewed in our conviction that our mission is as servants, placing ourselves at the needs of others before our own. It is difficult to know what we are unable to see. We can ask Jesus to heal our blindness and to allow us to follow him on the road, especially when it leads us to Jerusalem - taking up our crosses, out of grateful love. Sometimes, the most ordinary of weeks can carry the deepest graces. The "work" we do to "place ourselves" in grace-filled situations is all about focus. It starts in the morning, in getting ourselves to a place in which we can name a need, a desire, which might not be very obvious, even though it is sitting in the center of our hearts. It takes a little practice to get good at this self-examination and humble openness to grace. After a while, it is so fulfilling, because it is so real. One part of the joy of this journey is coming to realize, to experience personally, that the God I deeply desire to find, wants infinitely more to be in a loving relationship with me. In every Ordinary Time life, there are "good days" and "bad days," but in this type of daily prayer, none of our days are ever alone.

## Living with Little Faith

There is a theme that runs through today's Gospel: trust in God above all else. Jesus offers a striking image to encourage such trust.

Using a technique often employed by Jewish rabbis, he argues from a lesser reality to a greater one.

If God cares for the birds of the air and the lilies of the field, how much more will he care for us? The beauty and order of nature testify that God is dependable.

But even with these strong signs of God's trustworthiness, we still need faith to believe. We would all prefer a strong faith that never wavers, but our faith is frequently weak.

The Gospel of Matthew is particularly attentive to this inadequacy. Five times in this Gospel Jesus rebukes his disciples with the phrase, "you of little

faith." It occurs in today's passage but also when Jesus calms the sea (8:26), when Peter walks on the water (14:31), when the disciples complain about the lack of bread (16:8), and when they are unable to heal an epileptic boy (17:20).

The tone of the rebuke is not harsh but encouraging. It addresses disciples whose faith is real but faltering. It is Jesus' way of saying, "Don't be afraid. Don't pull back. Don't believe less—believe more!"

Jesus calls us to believe more. Our faith need not be irrepressible or heroic. We can build on what we have, even though we sometimes hesitate and doubt. God is with us, so there is no reason for fear. A weak faith can deepen. A little faith can grow.



## The Faith of the Church

Our weakness, if it leads to humility, actually strengthens our relationship with God. When we address God in prayer, we should not speak from the height of our pride and will but with a humble and contrite heart. Humility, then is the foundation of prayer. Our ability to pray and to believe is always the gift of God to us (Cf. *Catechism of the Catholic Church* 2559).



## Questions of the Week

The Gospel encourages us to draw upon the beauty of our world as a support to our faith. When we behold the perfection of a lily or marvel at the industry of the birds of the air, we receive a glimpse of God's providence.

### Adults

*What signs can I recognize in my family, work, or world that point to God's care for me?*

### Children

*Who loves me deeply? What does that love tell me about God's love for me?*

## Responding to God's Word . . .

The rebuke, "you of little faith," is not intended to attack us but to encourage us. It reminds us that our faith need not be perfect, only present. God will work with our inadequacies and support us in our doubts. This perspective leads us to a true humility. We believe not because we are so strong and faithful, but because God helps us in our weakness.

When our children make decisions that are disappointing and harmful, we need not have complete faith that all will work out for the best. We only need to believe that God loves

our children even more than we do. When we receive a negative medical diagnosis, trusting in God gives us the confidence to face whatever pain may come. God, ever-present, will show us the way. When we lose a loved one in death, we need not be joyful that he or she is with God in heaven. We only need to recall God's goodness and ask for the strength to carry our grief one more day.

Our little faith, when embraced with humility, is all God needs to bring us to life.

## SUGGESTIONS

*Use one of these suggestions or one of your own to respond to God's Word this week.*

**In the home.** Affirm a member of your family because of his or her ability to witness faith to others.

**In the workplace or in school.** Identify someone who is struggling to trust in God. Express your belief that God is with him or her.

**In the community.** Give of your time or ability for a project that you value because of your faith.



### Meditation Moment

A woman was about to take a shower. She had one foot in the shower and the other foot on the bathroom rug. As she stood in this awkward position, she thought to herself, "This is a good picture of my life." She had long wanted to commit her life to God, but she could never quite do it. She kept one foot in and one foot out. Now the time had come to decide. She paused for a long time. Then, taking a deep breath, she said aloud, "I choose you, Lord!" With that, she stepped into the shower. It was like being baptized.

### For reflection . . .

*Is there an area in my relationship with the Lord where I am failing to be decisive, keeping one foot in and one foot out?*

Although the story of Jesus' cure of a possessed boy also occurs in Matthew (17:14–21) and Luke (9:37–43a), only Mark (9:14–29) reports Jesus' request that the boy's father believe in his power to heal. The father's response is marked with humility. He admits that his faith is incomplete. Yet he offers the little faith he has, and it is enough to cure his son.
