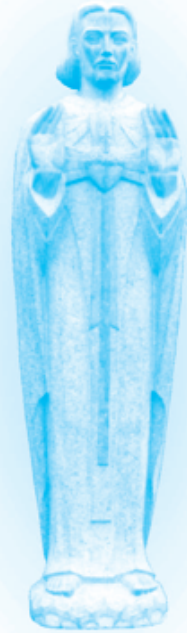

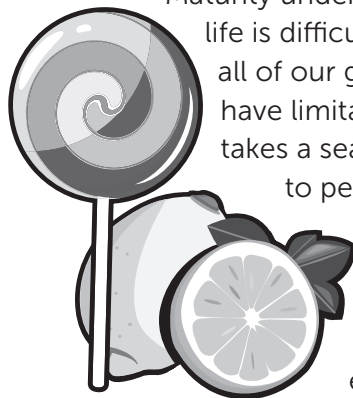

The Bittersweet Gospel

The flavor of Christian living is bittersweet. It is an acquired taste. Children prefer to eat things that are sweet. Their desires are closely tied to sugar and dessert. One of the signs that we are entering adult life is the ability to expand our palates beyond saccharine categories. This shift is connected to another dimension of the maturing process: the recognition that many of the experiences of adult living go beyond the enjoyable.



Maturity understands that life is difficult and that all of our greatest gifts have limitations. It takes a seasoned eye to perceive that some of our deepest joys have their darker edges, that

adult living is seldom entirely sweet or sour, but frequently a mixture of the two together.

Jesus recognizes this truth in today's Gospel when he pulls together two realities, which seem to contradict each other. He talks about a yoke that is easy, about a burden that is light. These conflicting images remind us how frequently life joins together the joyful and the sad, the easy and the difficult, the bitter and the sweet.

What Jesus says in the Gospel is that somehow we must find a way to take up this easy yoke, to accept this strange mixture that life places before us. Today's Gospel calls us to embrace the compromised nature of living, believing that life does not need to be pure and serene to be blessed, that it is precisely in the uncomfortable mixture of joy and pain, of love and regret that salvation will be found.



The Faith of the Church

The Bishops of the Second Vatican Council recognized the presence of God's grace in the mixed qualities of human life. In the opening lines of the *Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World*, they asserted that the church identifies with the joys, hopes, sorrows, and anxieties of the people of our time. Nothing genuinely human fails to raise an echo in the hearts of those who follow Christ.



Questions of the Week

Jesus borrows the image of a yoke from other Jewish teachers who spoke about the "yoke of the Torah." By applying this image to his teaching and by calling it "easy," Jesus emphasizes the joy of following the Gospel.

Adults

When have I seen God's blessings in a difficult situation? How can such experiences prepare me to face present troubles?

Children

How can I remember that God is with me not only when my life is easy but when I struggle, not only when I am happy but when I am afraid?

Responding to God's Word . . .

We follow Jesus by accepting the compromised nature of our lives.

Some parents and children may be able to look at each other and say, "You are all that I ever wanted you to be." But most of us find that in any deep relationship there is not only love but also resentment, not only pride but also disappointment. In these cases, Jesus invites us to embrace our bittersweet relationships for what they are, reminding us that to do so is God's will.

Some people may be able to say, "Every task to which I put my hand was a success." But most

of us find that along with our successes, there were dreams we were never able to reach and failures that continue to haunt us. In these cases, the Gospel invites us to take up the light burden of our life and to move forward with the knowledge that to carry such a yoke is to follow the Master.

Today's Gospel invites us to acquire a taste for adult living. With God's help, we can carry the light and heavy burdens that life demands. We can find the wisdom to savor the sweetness of life wherever we find it, even in the presence of the bitter.

SUGGESTIONS

Use one of these suggestions or one of your own to respond to God's Word this week.

In the home. Identify someone in your family with whom you struggle. Spend some time in prayer, thanking God for what is good in your relationship with that person.

In the workplace or in school.

Affirm someone in your school or office, especially if they are someone with whom you often disagree.

In the community. Locate a person who is doing a good job but who may be discouraged. Share with him or her a blessing in your shared situation or relationship.



Meditation Moment

Roger Bolduc died in Waterville, Maine, after a long bout with cancer. He saw his illness as a gift from God. Shortly before dying, he wrote: "Many things upon which I placed importance in the past seem so trivial now. . . . God has become so real. . . . I have always felt close to God, but I feel even closer now. I feel that he loves me more than ever. . . . I can feel his power—it's always there. I feel that God has answered my prayers. . . . I feel loved."
